Free Training

Monday – December 5th

Overview of the Kentucky OSH Program

8:30 - 11:30 a.m.

This session discusses the obligation to provide a safe and healthy workplace free from recognized hazards. Topics of discussion include the operations of the Kentucky Occupational Safety and Health Program, including enforcement and voluntary compliance services, and safety and health topics currently being considered for future standards and policies.

Welding

1:00 – 4:00 p.m.

This session is designed to increase the participant's knowledge of the processes and hazards associated with welding operations in the construction industry. Topics include the various types of welding processes such as oxy-acetylene, TIG, MIG, and open arc, personal protective equipment, safety and health hazard recognition and control, and Kentucky occupational safety and health requirements.

Tuesday – December 6st

Fall Protection

8:30 - 11:30 a.m.

This session covers the elements of 1926.500-503 and associated industry standards. Topics include: requirement to provide a fall protection system, the description and requirements for each fall protection system, and training requirements. Attendees should leave with a basic understanding of KyOSH's requirements for working at heights on commercial construction sites and residential construction sites.

Confined Space for Construction

1:00 - 4:00 p.m.

This session explains the regulations regarding entry into and working in confined spaces. The new standard, Subpart AA of 29 CFR 1926 will help prevent construction workers from being hurt or killed by eliminating and isolating hazards in confined spaces at construction sites similar to the way workers in other industries are already protected.

Wednesday – December 7th

Injury and Illness Recordkeeping

8:00 - 12:0 p.m.

This session is for those persons responsible for maintaining the revised injury and illness records. The forms 300, 301, 300A will be covered. The regulations and guidelines for recordkeeping will be discussed, as well as the compliance directive the Kentucky OSH compliance officer will use to evaluate your records. A recordkeeping example workshop will be part of the course, time permitting. **Note:** Students will receive an OTI certificate for this class.

Silica

1:00 - 4:00 p.m.

This session will cover OSHA's Final Rule for Exposure to Respirable Crystalline Silica that was published on March 25, 2016. The new rule covers specifics for General Industry and Construction including: the history of silica, the new Permissible Exposure Limit (PEL) vs. the previous PEL formula, exposure assessment, regulated areas, engineering controls, personal protective equipment, medical surveillance, recordkeeping and compliance dates for General Industry and Construction. Engineering and work practice controls for Table 1 in construction will be included. This course will help employers understand the new requirements of the new Silica Rule.

Thursday – December 8th

Excavation and Trenching

8:30 - 11:30 a.m.

This session considers provisions carried under 1926, Subpart C and Subpart P, related to trenching and excavation safety. The class will review site preparation, opening and working in an excavation, and the requirements for employee protection. Sample Emergency Action Plan and Daily Excavation Checklists are provided. Note: Attendees will not become a "competent person" from only attending this course.

Crane Safety

1:00 - 4:00 p.m.

This session addresses major changes which took effect on Nov. 8, 2010, providing a basic overview of 1926, Subpart CC, including mobile cranes, tower cranes and certifications requirements for crane operators. Topics will also include requirements for riggers, electrical hazards, and crane inspections.
