Kentucky Department of Workers' Claims

The Workers' Compensation Nominating Committee is now accepting applications for four Administrative Law Judge positions in the Kentucky Department of Workers' Claims for terms expiring July 14, 2024. These are full-time positions and appointees shall not hold any other public office or maintain any private practice.

An applicant must be a licensed attorney with a minimum of five (5) years experience in the Commonwealth in the practice of workers' compensation law or a related field and have extensive knowledge of workers' compensation law [KRS 342.230(3)]. The salary to be paid is that of a Circuit Court Judge.
